School Uniform and Equipment

Updated for 2019

THE SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR PUPILS

Autumn/Spring term:

- Blue school sweat shirt or cardigan embroidered with a school logo
- Light blue school polo shirt
- Full length, dark grey tailored trousers
- Grey knee length skirt or grey pinafore
- Grey or black tights
- White or grey socks

Summer term:

As Autumn / Spring, plus the additional options of:

- Blue and white checked summer dress
- Grey kneelength shorts

Shoes:

Fully black footwear

All pupils are required to wear sensible black footwear for school therefore, high heels are not allowed in the interest of safety.

Jewellery:

- The wearing of jewellery is discouraged.
- A watch and stud earrings may be worn but they are the responsibility of the child. All jewellery must be removed by the child for PE and Games. If earrings cannot be removed because the ears are within 6 weeks of being pierced the child must not take part. Safety of pupils in physical lessons is paramount.

Hairstyles:

- Hairstyles are expected to be neat, tidy and sensible.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- No shaven or coloured hairstyles
- Make-up, nail varnish and tattoos must not be worn
- Summer caps / hats may be worn outdoors and with the peak to the front.

Physical Education (P.E.)

All pupils require <u>black shorts</u> and a <u>white t-shirt</u> kept in a suitably sized draw stringed bag.

A tracksuit / jogging suit may be worn for games in the colder winter months.

For P.E. outside:

All Foundation Phase pupils will also require plimsolls (elasticated type, not laces) All Key Stage 2 pupils will need strong trainers with good grips.

Bare feet for dance and gymnastics inside.

Equipment

Bags

There is a limited amount of space around each child's peg in the cloakrooms.

Therefore, if bags are too big they often fall to the floor and there's a risk of the contents being damaged. They also cause a significant trip hazard in a small cloakroom space.

To avoid this, we ask that <u>no large rucksacks / backpacks are brought into school</u>.

PE kits should be stored in a draw string bag which can hang easily on a peg and can be kept in school.





Lunch bags / boxes, if your child brings their own sandwiches, will be stored in a large basket or trolley per class.





Reading books and homework items should be brought to school in a bookbag, satchel or messenger bag – all of which are able to be hung on a peg and be flat to the wall, without being easily knocked off.





Pencil Cases

Pencil cases and items of own stationery are not needed as school provides the necessary equipment.

Therefore, <u>no pencil cases / stationery from home</u> in any classes in order to maximise the working space on tables.
